EXECUTIVE ORDER

I, MICHAEL A. BILANDIC, Mayor of the City of Chicago, in the State of Illinois, hereby declare and order as follows:

PART I

That all Departments of the City of Chicago shall follow Energy Conservation Policies in the administration and operation of their respective areas of responsibilities to the end that each shall:

1. Insure that the potential for energy savings is properly considered in the evaluation of all materials, equipment and vehicles purchased by the City. Life-cycle costing or other effective techniques are to be applied wherever possible.

2. Maintain and operate all City owned or leased equipment, mobile or fixed, in a manner that effects the greatest possible efficiency in energy saving terms, and insure that all operating personnel are fully trained in conservation techniques.
3. Maintain and operate all public buildings and facilities in a manner that effects the greatest possible efficiencies in energy saving terms through the careful management of lighting, heating, ventilation, air-conditioning and communication systems, and the recirculation of decorative fountains.
4. Preserve, improve, and increase the efficiency of existing public buildings and facilities wherever possible in a manner consistent with the most effective energy saving techniques.
5. Insure that all new public construction employs the most modern energy saving design and materials, and establish guidelines and regulations necessary to that end.

6. Encourage and, as necessary, regulate all new private construction to follow modern energy saving design and application of materials.
7. Encourage the rehabilitation and recycling of the existing stock of private buildings as energy saving per se, and encourage the incorporation of energy saving materials, equipment and techniques in such projects.
8. Foster urban development patterns which will reflect and support energy savings in transportation and site and building arrangement and design, especially in planned development and renewal activities.
9. Expand and promote recycling programs such as solid waste conversion and other forms of energy recapture.
10. Encourage the development and use of alternate energy sources such as solar and wind energy.
11. Continue to emphasize and encourage the use of mass transportation and continue the improvement of traffic and circulation patterns through

improved signalization, channelization of intersections, the encouragement of shared ride programs and continued research and innovation.

12. Develop programs to encourage all citizens to conserve energy in the home, the car, and at work. Conduct a concerted advisory program stressing the need for and the value of energy savings and showing the many techniques and opportunities available in the whole range of citizen activity.

PART II

There is hereby established a Chicago Energy Policy Council. Members of the council will be appointed from backgrounds such as research, finance, manufacturing, commerce, utilities and consumerism. The Policy Council shall provide expertise in the development and management of energy policies and shall at the same time demonstrate the commitment of their respective associations to sound energy policy. An Energy Coordinator shall also be appointed who shall serve as chairman of the council whose duties shall include development of new programs and effective coordination of existing programs. An assistant energy coordinator shall be appointed who

shall be chairman of the Interdepartmental Energy Committee. The committee will be responsible for investigating methods of conserving energy resources within city buildings and monitor implementation of any conservation plan adopted. Each City department shall contribute a representative to serve on the committee.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

I, Michael A. Bilandic, Mayor of the City of Chicago,
in the State of Illinois, hereby declare and order as follows:

That the licensed premises located in the City of Chicago, in an area bounded by 67th Street on the North, 71st Street on the South, Kedzie Avenue on the West and Western Avenue on the East, shall not conduct the business of selling alcoholic beverages on the licensed premises from 12:00 Noon up to and including 6:00 P.M. on July 9, 1978.

This Order is issued in light of the scheduled demonstrations in the above-mentioned area, which together with the continued operation of these licensed premises, will immediately threaten the welfare of the community.
