


EXECUTIVE ORDER 87-7

I, EUGENE SAWYER, Acting Mayor of the City of Chicago in the State of Illinois do hereby declare and order as follows:



EXECUTIVE ORDER 88-2

WHEREAS, a fundamental goal of the people of the City of Chicago is the educational development of all persons to the extent of their capabilities; and

WHEREAS, a sound educational reform implementation plan with long and short term goals related to reform initiatives is essential to the continued successful operation of any school system; and

WHEREAS, it is vital to personal development and to community, commercial, educational and cultural interests that public schools provide a quality educational program; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the City of Chicago has the duty to consider and approve courses of study, textbooks and other educational apparatus, to appoint qualified teachers and to secure for all students the right and opportunity to an equal and quality education; and

WHEREAS, every available means of assisting the Board to achieve its important mission should be encouraged and explored; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide for the creation of a School Reform Authority to promote the objectives of quality education and excellence in the classroom in the Chicago School System and to promote sound educational management and reform to ensure that a standard of excellence is set as an objective and attained by the school system;

NOW THEREFORE, I, EUGENE SAWYER, Acting Mayor of the City of Chicago in the State of Illinois do hereby declare and order as follows:

**SECTION 1.** There is hereby established a School Reform Authority. The purpose of the Authority shall be to monitor the reform programs of the Chicago Board of Education and ensure that the Board implements the reform recommendations developed by the Mayor's Education Summit.

**SECTION 2.** The Authority shall consist of seven members appointed by the Mayor. The Mayor shall designate a chairman from among the appointed members. Three members shall be appointed to an initial term of two years and four members shall be appointed to an initial term of three years. Thereafter, each member will serve for up to three years and until a successor has been appointed. Vacancies on the Authority shall be filled in the same manner that the original appointments are made and shall be filled for the unexpired term of the member whose place has become vacant. Members of the Authority may be reappointed for subsequent terms.

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CHICAGO, ILL.

**SECTION 3.** No member of the Authority may receive compensation, except that each member may be reimbursed for expenses reasonably incurred in the performance of his or her duties.

**SECTION 4.** The School Reform Authority shall have the following powers and duties:

- (a) To approve or reject in its totality the five year educational reform implementation plan and annual work program for the Board;

(b) To monitor the implementation of the reform plan and the annual work program throughout the school year and evaluate its effectiveness;

(c) To receive and analyze information from the State and Local Board of Education to determine whether funding for categorical programs is being used as intended;

(d) To contact and receive certification from the School Finance Authority to confirm that the Board's budget enables it to comply with the reform objectives;

(e) To make recommendations to the Board for additional programs and plans necessary to improve the educational quality of the public schools;

(f) To provide information to the School Finance Authority, the General Assembly and the State Board of Education regarding the implementation of the Board's plan;

(g) To submit annual and quarterly reports to the Mayor and the public on the Board's progress in effectuating its five year educational reform implementation plan and annual work program.



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**SECTION 5.** The Authority may accept offers of gifts and may apply for grants from any governmental agency or funding source for projects furthering the implementation of its duties.

SECTION 6. The School Reform Authority shall exercise its powers and perform its duties during the 1988-1989 school year and shall continue fulfilling its mandate until such time as its function may be superceded by state legislation.

**EXECUTIVE ORDER 88-3**

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the City of Chicago to encourage and support full and equal accessibility by persons with disabilities to all aspects of life including education, employment, health care, housing, recreation, social services, and all municipal services and programs; and

WHEREAS, the Department on Aging and Disability works with public and private organizations and individuals to identify and eliminate architectural and attitudinal barriers that prevent persons with disabilities from enjoying such access; and

WHEREAS, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in any federally assisted program; now, therefore,

I, EUGENE SAWYER, Acting Mayor of the City of Chicago, do hereby ORDER:

SECTION 1. An Equal Access Council is hereby established for the purpose of participating in and promoting the development and implementation of policies and practices that comply with

both Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Illinois Environmental Barriers Act by ensuring accessibility for all persons to City facilities and services.

SECTION 2. The Council will include eight consumers who have knowledge of and expertise in matters related to the Council's concerns, and will also include the heads of the following departments and agencies or their designees:

Department on Aging and Disability  
Department of Economic Development  
Department of General Services  
Department of Health  
Department of Housing  
Department of Human Services  
Department of Inspectional Services  
Department of Law  
Department of Personnel  
Department of Planning  
Department of Public Works  
Department of Streets and Sanitation  
Mayor's Office of Employment and Training  
Office of the Zoning Administrator


The Commissioner of the Department on Aging and Disability and a consumer designated by the Mayor shall act as co-chairpersons of the Council. The consumer members shall be appointed for two year terms.

SECTION 3. The Council shall monitor the progress of all city departments and agencies toward compliance with its policies. All executive departments and agencies shall cooperate with the Council in implementation of such policies.

SECTION 4. The Council will report annually to the Mayor on its work and the status of equal accessibility by persons with disabilities to city facilities, programs and services.



EXECUTIVE ORDER 89-1

WHEREAS, the Human Immunodeficiency Virus ("HIV") is the virus that may ultimately result in Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome ("AIDS"); and

WHEREAS, HIV-related conditions, as defined in this order, may result in medical consequences which impair a person's health and ability to work safely and effectively; and

WHEREAS, HIV-related conditions may not necessarily result in an employee's inability to perform job duties; and

WHEREAS, persons with HIV-related conditions may wish to continue to engage in as many of their normal activities, including work, as their condition allows; and

WHEREAS, current medical research indicates no medical basis for refusing, or threatening to refuse, to hire, train or work with a person with an HIV-related condition; and

WHEREAS, HIV-related conditions constitute a disability as defined in Chicago's Human Rights Ordinance, Chapter 199 of the Municipal Code of Chicago; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the City of Chicago, contained in its Human Rights Ordinance and in its Personnel Code, Chapter 25.1 of the Municipal Code, to prohibit and prevent discrimination in employment against any person due the person's real or perceived disabilities; and

WHEREAS, discrimination and prejudice against persons with HIV-related conditions can best be avoided by ongoing education, information and counseling services to managers, supervisors and personnel of the various departments and agencies of the City government concerning the nature and effect of HIV-related conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of the Department of Personnel has the authority under Chapter 25.1 of the Municipal Code to foster programs for the improvement of employee effectiveness, and to promulgate rules for the enforcement and administration of the City's Personnel Code; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health is authorized by Section 9-20 of the Municipal Code to publish information concerning matters of public health; now, therefore,

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DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

I, EUGENE SAWYER, Mayor of the City of Chicago, Illinois, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. Whenever used in this order, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- (a) "AIDS" means Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome.
- (b) "ARC" means AIDS-Related Complex.
- (c) "HIV" means Human Immunodeficiency Virus, the virus that ultimately results in AIDS.
- (d) "HIV-related condition" means any of the following: AIDS; ARC; presence of AIDS antibody (indicating exposure to HIV) without symptoms of AIDS or ARC.
- (e) "Perception" or "perceived" includes both accurate and inaccurate perceptions.

SECTION 2. The Commissioner of the Department of Personnel shall conduct the following activities as part of a program of employee education concerning HIV-related conditions and the prohibition against discrimination based on non-job related disability:

- (a) increase awareness throughout the City government of the Support Services for City employees and their families, currently available through the Employee Assistance Program in the Department of Personnel;
- (b) increase awareness of the availability of Counseling, currently available through the Benefits Management Office, to assist employees in managing health benefits, and of counseling available through the Department of Personnel concerning leaves

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of absence;

(c) prepare and promulgate an amendment to the City's Personnel Rules concerning appropriate personnel administration relative to HIV-related conditions, including: a statement of the policy of the City of Chicago prohibiting discrimination based on perceived non-job related disabilities, including HIV-related conditions; and a statement of the responsibilities of department managers, supervisors and employees in dealing with workers and clients with perceived HIV-related conditions.

SECTION 3. The Commissioner of the Department of Health shall conduct the following activities as part of a program of employee education concerning HIV-related conditions and the prohibition against discrimination based on non-job related disability:

(a) increase awareness throughout the City government of the confidential HIV Antibody Testing Program, currently available through the AIDS activity Office of the Department of Health; notices of the availability of this service shall indicate that the testing is free of charge and done anonymously.

(b) increase awareness throughout the City government of the AIDS Hotline, currently available through the AIDS activity Office of the Department of Health; advertisement of the AIDS Hotline shall include the appropriate telephone numbers and a statement that calls may be made anonymously and will be handled confidentially.

SECTION 4. The Commissioner of the Department of Personnel and the Commissioner of the Department of Health, with the assistance of the Corporation Counsel, shall prepare a comprehensive educational program for use by supervisors and managers in the various departments concerning HIV-related conditions and appropriate personnel practices relating thereto.

SECTION 5. This order shall take effect upon its execution and delivery to the City Clerk for filing.
