The following is said proposed resolution:

WHEREAS, The members of this chamber were deeply saddened to learn of the death on April 17, 2009, at age ninety-three, of Arturo Velasquez, a prominent community leader, entrepreneur, philanthropist and a distinguished City Colleges trustee; and

WHEREAS, Born in the town of Totolan, Jalisco, Mexico, Mr. Velasquez came to the United States as a young child. His family worked on farms in Texas and the upper Midwest before settling in Chicago's Chinatown neighborhood. Mr. Velasquez graduated from Haines Elementary School and attended Crane Technical High School; and

WHEREAS, In 1938, Mr. Velasquez founded the Velasquez Automatic Music Company at 4539 South Ashland Avenue in the Back of the Yards neighborhood. Through Mr. Velasquez' hard work and business savvy, the company grew to be one of the largest coin-operated juke box and amusement machine vendors in Chicago; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Velasquez served his country with pride and distinction as a member of the United States Army during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Velasquez was known for encouraging and inspiring others to succeed. In 1970, he supported ten young entrepreneurs in founding Azteca Foods, Inc.. Thanks to Mr. Velasquez' benevolence and the skilled management of his son, Arthur, the company grew into a multimillion dollar food products business; and

WHEREAS, In 1975, Mayor Richard J. Daley appointed Mr. Velasquez as the first Mexican-American trustee of the City Colleges of Chicago, a position he held until 1987 and he also served as the secretary of the board of trustees for several years; and

WHEREAS, A dedicated community leader who diligently served Chicago's Mexican-American community, Mr. Velasquez was a co-founder and chapter president of the Azteca Lions Club. Mr. Velasquez was also instrumental in the founding of the Mexican-American Chamber of Commerce of Illinois, the Illinois Federation of Mexican-Americans, the Spanish Speaking Study Commission, the Mexican Civic Society, and the Mexican-American Democrats of Cook County; and

WHEREAS, A true philanthropist, Mr. Velasquez organized and raised funds for several charities, including Holy Cross Church, Cordi Marian Settlement Home, Holy Trinity High School, Claretian Missionaries, Niños y Jovenes Orphanage (Jalisco, Mexico), and Alivio Medical Center. Mr. Velasquez was also director and president of the City Colleges of Chicago Foundation, which raises money for scholarships for Latino students; and

WHEREAS, In 1981 and 1988, Mr. Velasquez received honorary doctorate degrees for public service from National-Louis University, where he served as a trustee, and from

Saint Xavier University. In 1999, he received from the Mexican government the "Ohtli Award", the Mexican Civic Society's 1986 "Man of the Year" Award, the Saint Augustine College's "Puente" Award, the Chicago Historical Society's 2002 "Making History" Award and the Illinois Hispanic Chamber of Commerce's 2006 "Pipila " Award; and

WHEREAS, In 2008, Richard J. Daley College's West Side Technical Institute was renamed "the Arturo Velasquez West Side Technical Institute" in honor of Mr. Velasquez; and

WHEREAS, A dedicated community leader and exemplary public servant, Mr. Velasquez will always be remembered for his many contributions to our city, for the opportunities he created, for his extraordinary civic influence and inspiration, and for his courage, faith and compassion; and

WHEREAS, Arturo Velasquez is survived by his loving wife, Shirley; his sons, Arthur and Edward; his daughters, Carmen and Maria Elena; his eleven grandchildren; his nineteen great-grandchildren; and a host of other family members and friends; now, therefore,

*Be It Resolved*, That we, the Mayor and the members of the City Council of the City of Chicago; assembled this thirteenth day of May, 2009, do hereby honor the life and memory of Arturo Velasquez and extend our heartfelt condolences to his family; and

*Be It Further Resolved*, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the family of Arturo Velasquez as a sign of our sympathy and good wishes.

On motion of Alderman Burke, seconded by Aldermen Cárdenas, Solis, Ocasio, Suarez, Mell and Colón, the foregoing proposed resolution was *Adopted* by a rising vote.

At this point in the proceedings, the Honorable Richard M. Daley, Mayor, rose to offer the prayers of his own family and the condolences of the people of Chicago to the family of Arturo Velasquez. Mayor Daley observed that in this city of immigrants, Arturo Velasquez was himself a proud immigrant who quickly assimilated into his new country. Arturo Velasquez understood that family is the very core of life. A dedicated and loving father, Arturo nourished the most American of goals -- a better life for his children and grandchildren through education, hard work and an entrepreneurial spirit. Arturo Velasquez also maintained an elemental conviction that one must give back. A member of the "greatest generation", Arturo gave to his country through his military service in World War II and as a community leader and successful businessman, Mr. Velasquez encouraged and inspired others through his achievements and helped provide new opportunities for young students to pursue their own version of the American dream by sponsoring academic scholarships. Arturo Velasquez was, Mayor Daley declared, a role model whose legacy is written in the lives he touched each day and the lasting contributions he made to our city. Mayor Daley then left the Mayor's rostrum and strode to the Commissioners' gallery where he conveyed his personal condolences to the family of Arturo Velasquez and presented them with parchment copies of the memorial resolution.

The following is said proposed resolution:

WHEREAS, In the early morning darkness of March 6, 2009, Police Officer Timothy J. Gould (Star Number 16184) and his partner were en route to a call for assistance when they noticed heavy smoke issuing from a three-story apartment building at 7947 South East End Avenue. Seconds later the two officers heard a transmission over their radio informing them of the fire; and

WHEREAS, Immediately Officer Gould told his partner to stop the car, then ran toward the building. He saw that the first floor was on fire, with thick smoke pouring from the windows, and he heard a victim's screams for help from within. A man was trapped in the building, unable to escape; and

WHEREAS, With firefighters still on the way, and because the raging fire and locked security gates prevented Officer Gould from entering through the front door, he yelled to the victim to try to move to the rear of the apartment. Officer Gould then ran to the rear and shouted to the victim to respond so he could gauge where the man was in the burning building; and

WHEREAS, When he could no longer hear replies, Officer Gould realized that because the man was losing consciousness, there was no time to lose, and he leapt into action. Stymied by the locked security gates, he located a window ten feet above the ground. He used a chair to break the window glass, then set the chair back down, took a running start and vaulted from the chair into the window opening, and climbed into the smoke-filled room; and

WHEREAS, Despite the absence of protective gear or an oxygen supply, and ignoring the risk of serious injury or death, Officer Gould felt around in the heavy smoke, shining his flashlight, continuing to call out and encouraging the victim to make noise in order to find him. Unable to see anything in the toxic, murky room, Officer Gould nonetheless found the man, wrapped the man's arms around his neck and dragged his limp body back to the window; and

WHEREAS, With the full weight of the unconscious man on his back, Officer Gould managed to climb back through the window, steady himself, then drop safely onto the chair ten feet below; and

WHEREAS, Fire personnel soon arrived, administered first aid to the victim, and extinguished the blaze; and

WHEREAS, If not for the heroism displayed by Officer Gould, the victim, a senior citizen, would have likely succumbed to the fire. With no regard for his personal safety, Officer Gould deliberately plunged into an inferno, knowing that he was the victim's only hope for survival; and

WHEREAS, Officer Gould, a former Navy sergeant and semi-pro football player, and an eighteen-year veteran of the Chicago Police Department, is to be commended for his quick thinking, strength and bravery in saving a man's life. Despite his humble protestations to the contrary, Officer Gould is a true hero; now, therefore,

*Be It Resolved*, That we, the Mayor and members of the City Council of the City of Chicago, assembled this thirteenth day of May, 2009, do hereby congratulate Police Officer Timothy J. Gould for performing heroically, above and beyond the call of duty; and

*Be It Further Resolved*, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Officer Timothy J. Gould, and placed on permanent record in his personnel file, as a token of our honor and esteem.

WHEREAS, On January 27, 2009, Chicago Fire Department Ambulance 2 arrived at the 3500 block of North Newcastle Avenue, responding to a call for help from the mother of an eight-year-old child who had suddenly fallen terribly ill; and

WHEREAS, The child was suffering from a rapid onset of nausea, vomiting and headache, leading Paramedic-in-Charge Jason Kasper and Firefighter/Paramedic John Pearson to examine her more closely; and

WHEREAS, Their assessment of the girl revealed an ominous progression of symptoms. The child was now paralyzed on her left side, lethargic, and had unequally sized pupils, making the paramedics suspect that her condition was extremely serious and life-threatening; and

WHEREAS, Realizing how grave the situation was, the two men took the child into the ambulance and began administering treatment to sustain her breathing and stave off any other potentially dire complications; and

WHEREAS, Acting on their professional knowledge and skill, the two paramedics decided to transport the child some distance across the city in order for her to be treated at Children's Memorial Hospital, for they knew that she would require expert treatment and would receive state-of-the-art care at Children's; and

WHEREAS, Pearson and Kasper safely and quickly transported the girl to Children's, where she received treatment for a ruptured cerebral aneurysm. The skilled surgeons at Children's were able to use an experimental procedure to stop her cerebral bleeding, which is normally inoperable and fatal; and

WHEREAS, Thanks to the quick thinking and expert skills of these two members of the Chicago Fire Department, the child made it through her life-saving surgery and recovered with an optimistic long-term prognosis; and

WHEREAS, The child likely would not have survived this devastating medical condition without the professional assessment and quick response of these paramedics; and

WHEREAS, These two men exemplify the skill, training and judgment which are hallmarks of the Chicago Fire Department; now, therefore,

*Be It Resolved*, That we, the Mayor and members of the City Council of the City of Chicago, assembled this thirteenth day of May, 2009, do hereby honor Paramedic-in-Charge Jason Kasper and Firefighter/Paramedic John Pearson for performing their duties in the proud tradition of the Chicago Fire Department, and thereby helping to save a child's life; and
