

Deadline looms for city stickers

The deadline to purchase vehicle stickers in Chicago is looming.

Current city stickers expire on June 30.

They can be bought online, at the clerk's office in Room 107 of City Hall, satellite clerk offices as well as at some local banks, retailers and currency exchanges. Some aldermanic offices also sell stickers on certain dates.

Customers should be forewarned that banks, currency exchanges and retailers can add a surcharge fee onto the cost of the stickers.

The city increased the price of some stickers to stave off its 2008 budget shortfall, according to the Chicago City Clerk Miguel Del Valle's Web site.

The fee is \$75 for small passenger vehicles under 4,500 pounds and \$120 for passenger vehicles 4,500 pounds or more. Seniors 65 and over pay \$30 for small and large passenger vehicles, according to the clerk's website office.

Stickers for truck A, 16,000 pounds or less, cost \$180 and for truck B, over 16,000 pounds, cost \$420. Truck C is eliminated.

The late fee for stickers purchased after June 30 is \$40.
