**CITY OF CHICAGO VEHICLE STICKERS AND RESIDENTIAL
ZONE PARKING PERMITS ON SALE JUNE 1st**
Neighborhood Sales Program at 49 aldermanic offices

The Office of the City Clerk has mailed renewal applications for the 2007-2008 vehicle stickers to Chicago residents. Chicago vehicle owners must display the new city sticker on cars, trucks and motorcycles registered in the city no later than July 15, 2007.

The cost of a passenger vehicle sticker is \$75, and a large passenger vehicle sticker costs \$90. Class A truck stickers (14,000 lbs. or less) are \$150 and motorcycle medallions are \$45. Senior citizens, 65 years and older, receive one passenger sticker for their automobile for \$30.

The 2007-2008 residential zone parking permits and daily pass renewal forms have also been mailed to residents who reside in zoned areas. The annual decal is \$25, and the price for a book of 15 guest passes is \$5. Residents are limited to the purchase of two books a month.

City Clerk Locations

Beginning Friday, June 1st, vehicle stickers, residential zone parking permits and daily guest passes may be purchased at City Hall, 121 N. LaSalle Street - Room 107 (Monday thru Friday 8:00 a.m.-5:00p.m.), 5301 S. Cicero Avenue, and 5430 W. Gale Street (Monday thru Friday 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. & Saturday 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon).

Chicago residents are encouraged to purchase their city vehicle sticker via the Internet at the City Clerk's website at www.chicityclerk.com or at the City of Chicago's website at www.cityofchicago.org. Passenger, large passenger and Class A truck vehicle stickers can be purchased online. Residents can make online credit card charges with Visa, MasterCard and American Express.

Aldermanic Office Sales and Additional Sales Locations

The City Clerk's office is teaming up with 49 aldermen to offer specific sale dates at various ward offices and locations to offer more convenience for city residents (attachment). Vehicle stickers and residential zone parking permits will be available on certain sale dates. For a complete schedule of ward sale dates, visit the City Clerk's website at www.chicityclerk.com. Please check website for updated information on certain wards without an address (due to Alderman-elected candidates).

In addition, stickers may be purchased at one of the following City of Chicago sales offices: 800 N. Kedzie Avenue, 4770 S. Kedzie Avenue, 2006 E. 95th Street, 2550 W. Addison Street and 400 W. Superior Street. Currency exchanges also sell vehicle stickers, but include a service fee. **Residential zone parking permits and passes are not sold at these locations.**

Theme

The 2007-2008 city sticker theme "Green Scene Chicago," highlights the City of Chicago's goal to become the most environmentally friendly city in the nation. Monica Rooker, a senior at Maria High School, designed this year's sticker. Her design was chosen from among over 400 submissions received by the City Clerk's office in the annual art contest for Chicago high school students.

Chicagoans must comply with the Wheel Tax Ordinance and display the new sticker on their windshields by the July 15th deadline or face tickets and fines. Money collected from the wheel tax is allocated to fund road improvements throughout Chicago. "Beginning June 1st, vehicle stickers can be purchased online. This will make it much more convenient for Chicagoans to buy their stickers", stated del Valle.
