**DEL VALLE TEAMS UP WITH BANKS TO MAKE
GETTING A VEHICLE STICKER EVEN MORE
CONVENIENT
PILOT PROGRAMS ADDS NEARLY 20 LOCATIONS FOR RESIDENTS
TO GET THEIR STICKERS**

City Clerk Miguel del Valle is making it even more convenient to get your city sticker by teaming up with banks to offer stickers right in your neighborhood. This pilot program coupled with sales at Aldermen's offices and the ability to purchase stickers online as well as an 800,000-piece city sticker renewal mailing is geared to making sure residents get their stickers before the July 15th deadline.

"My goal is to have city stickers available as widely as possible to prevent people from getting a \$120 ticket and paying a \$40 penalty for not getting their city sticker on time", said City Clerk del Valle. "That is why we are teaming up with banks to make getting a city sticker as convenient as possible," the City Clerk added.

Many banks are selling the stickers free of charge to their customers. To see a complete listing of banks near you go to www.ChiCityClerk.com or call 312-744-1528. The City Clerk's website also includes a list of dates and times that city stickers are available at Aldermen's offices. In addition, stickers can be purchased online at www.ChiCityClerk.com.

Residential zone parking permits and daily guest passes are only available at City Clerk's offices at City Hall, 121 N. LaSalle Street - Room 107 (Monday thru Friday 8:00 a.m.-5:00p.m.), 5301 S. Cicero Avenue, and 5430 W. Gale Street (Monday thru Friday 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. & Saturday 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon). Banks will only sell passenger, large passenger and senior vehicle stickers.

Vehicle stickers are available starting June 1st. Chicago vehicle owners must display the new city sticker on cars, trucks and motorcycles registered in the city no later than July 15, 2007. The cost of a passenger vehicle sticker is \$75, and a large passenger vehicle sticker costs \$90. Class A truck stickers (14,000 lbs. or less) are \$150 and motorcycle medallions are \$45. Senior citizens, 65 years and older, receive one passenger sticker for their automobile for \$30. Money collected from the wheel tax is allocated to fund road improvements throughout Chicago.
