**City Clerk del Valle Teams Up with Jewel-
Osco and Dominick's – Get Your Vehicle
Sticker While Grocery Shopping**
*Retailer and Bank Locations Add 86 Additional Sites for
Residents to Get Their City Stickers*

City Clerk Miguel del Valle is making it even more convenient to get your city vehicle sticker by teaming up with Jewel-Osco, Dominick's, and participating banks to offer them right in your neighborhood. Residents can now purchase the 2008 – 2009 vehicle sticker while they are doing their grocery shopping. All Chicago Jewel-Osco and Dominick's locations, including stores bordering the City of Chicago, will be selling passenger, larger passenger, senior citizen, and Truck (A) vehicle stickers.

This retail and bank program coupled with online sales at www.ChiCityClerk.com, sales at Aldermen's offices, Department of Revenue substations and currency exchanges as well as a 1.2 million piece city sticker renewal mailing is geared to make sure residents get their stickers before enforcement and penalty fees begin on July 16, 2008.

“My goal is to have city stickers available as widely as possible to prevent people from getting a ticket and paying a penalty fee for not getting their city vehicle sticker on time,” said City Clerk del Valle. “That is why we are teaming up with retailers and banks to make getting a city sticker as convenient as possible.”

The 2007 – 2008 vehicle stickers and residential parking permits expire on June 30, 2008. City Clerk del Valle provides a 15-day grace period for vehicle stickers before enforcement begins on July 16, 2008. There is no grace period for residential parking permits. Vehicle stickers are available at City Hall, City Clerk del Valle satellite offices, Department of Revenue Substations, currency exchanges, participating banks and retailers and on select days at Aldermanic offices. Currency Exchanges, Banks, and Retailers can charge a service fee of up to \$5.50 for selling consumers vehicle stickers.
